

spiritual blindness kept them from recognizing the truth. Later, the apostle Paul put it this way, **“But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.”** (II Corinthians 4:3-4) What Paul refers to as **“our gospel”** is the message that Jesus was crucified, buried and rose again, to pay the penalty for our sin. **“The god of this world”** refers to Satan, who is the enemy of God and is in control of everyone who

has not been redeemed through faith in Jesus Christ.

So, how is your eyesight—your spiritual eyesight?

Do you see yourself as a sinner? God does. **“For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.”** (Romans 3:23) **“There is none righteous, no, not one.”** (Romans 3:10)

Do you see that ALL sinners are headed for an eternity under God’s judgment?

“He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.” (John 3:36)

The letters on the front of this tract are similar to what you would see on an eye chart. The standard eye chart in use today is a variation of the eye chart that was designed by Dr. Hermann Snellen in 1862. This variation is often referred to as the Tumbling E Chart. Instead of using various letters from the alphabet, it uses the letter E. It was designed especially for children and others who are not familiar with the Arabic alphabet. If you can see the Es on this tract clearly at ten feet, you probably have normal visual acuity. Of course, there are some exceptions. While you may be able to see
