

but is a direct revelation from God. *“All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.”* (II Timothy 3:16)

Freemasons view Jesus as an important person but do not see him as divine and the exclusive way to Heaven. Freemasons are expected to refrain from using the name of Jesus in prayers, because it may be offensive to others. His name has been omitted from Biblical verses that are used in Masonic ritual.

In contrast, the Bible says, *“... God also has highly exalted him [Jesus], and given him a name which is above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of*

things in heaven and things in earth, and things under the earth; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.” (Philippians 2:9-11)

What’s more, the Bible teaches that no one can get to Heaven except by way of Jesus. *“Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men whereby we must be saved.”* (Acts 4:12)

In the public eye Freemasons are often recognized for their altruistic activities. Freemasons are good people, at least they believe that they are.

Freemasons admit that they have human flaws; but given time and opportunity, they hope to improve themselves enough to please God.

enter Heaven. It’s as if God places one’s good deeds and bad deeds on a scale. If the good outweighs the bad, they are allowed to enter Heaven.

A primary tenant of Freemasonry is brotherly love, which is often expressed as the Golden Rule: *“Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.”*

Again, they believe that salvation is obtained through good works.

On the contrary, the Bible says, *“Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his [God’s] mercy he saved us...”* (Titus 3:5)

Freemasons believe that the Bible is just one of many volumes of sacred writings, such as the Koran.

Christians believe that the Bible is not the product of human wisdom

Unfortunately, the Bible makes it clear that none of us is good. *“For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.”* (Romans 3:23)

The consequence of our sin? None of us can enter Heaven, unless something is done about our sin.

God’s solution. Jesus died to pay the penalty for our sin. *“Who [Jesus] his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.”* (1 Peter 2:24)

Were you planning to get to Heaven by adhering to the teachings of Freemasonry, or do you know someone who is?

Seriously consider what you have just read.

The Bible, however, teaches that there is one True and Living God. *“I am the Lord, and there is none else, there is no God beside me.”* (Isaiah 45:5)

Freemasons believe what is commonly referred to as the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man. In essence they believe that all of us are God’s children and we should treat each other as brothers and sisters.

Of course, Jesus was not of the same opinion. He told those who would not accept His teaching that they were of their *“father the devil.”* (John 8:44)

God is the Creator of all human beings, but He is not everyone’s Father. Freemasons believe that those who live a moral life are entitled to

There are some who claim to be Christians and Freemasons. They are deceiving themselves. Either they are not fully trusting Freemasonry to get them to Heaven or they are not fully trusting Jesus to get them to Heaven.

Where does that put you? By recognizing that you are a sinner and by asking Jesus Christ to save you, right now, you can be sure that you will go to Heaven. Will you do it?



Those who belong to the Masonic Lodge call themselves Freemasons.
