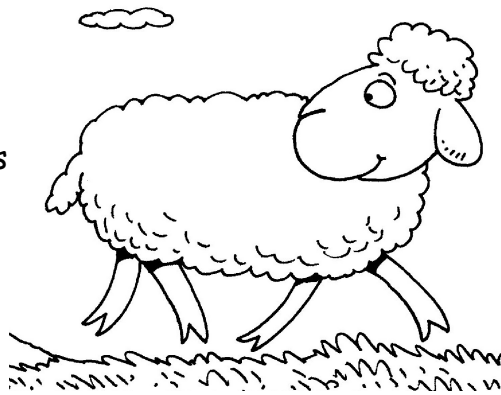


Then he called all his friends and neighbors to tell them about it . He had a big celebration because he was very glad that he found his lost sheep.

When Jesus finished telling the story, everyone was silent.

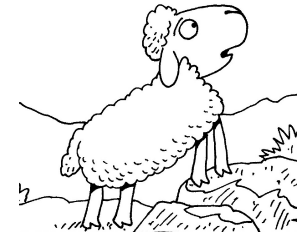
Then He said this :

Have you ever made a bad choice? I have. But we can all learn from our mistakes , hey.

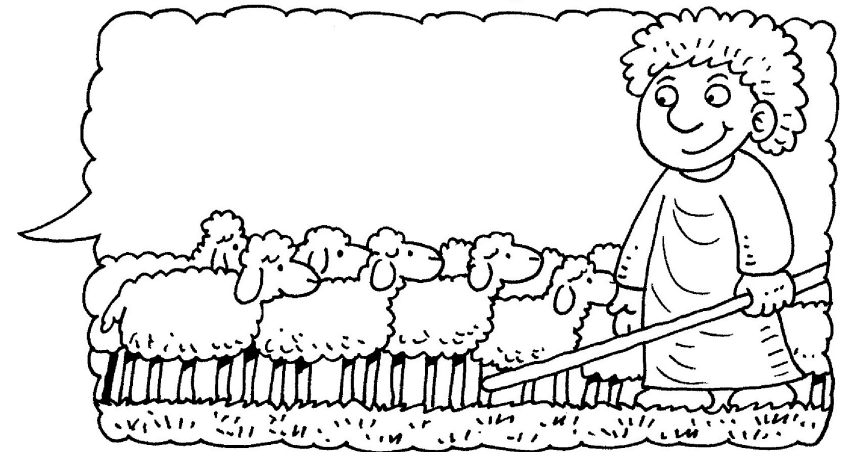
Some people keep on making bad choices. In the Bible times, some of the church leaders treated these people badly. They thought they were better than others. They also tried to avoid them.

But Jesus didn't do that. When He was on earth, He was always very kind and fair to people.

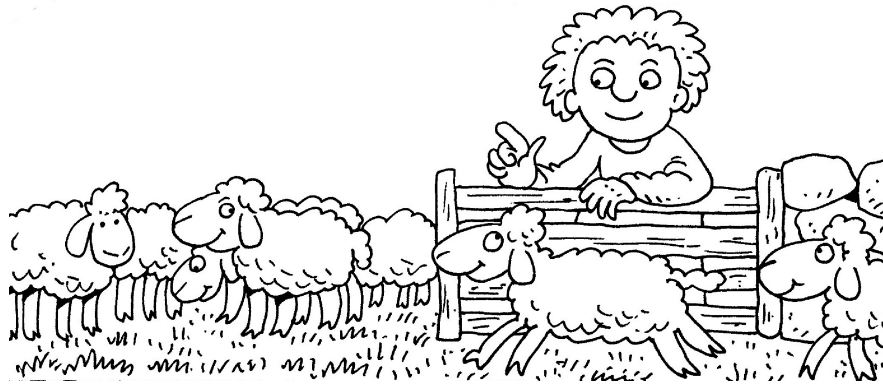
(He is still like that today.)

one of his sheep was missing!

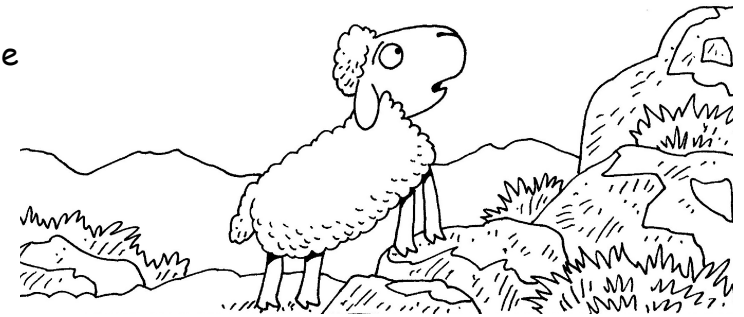


The man was very upset about it because he loved his sheep.

It was getting dark but he didn't mind.

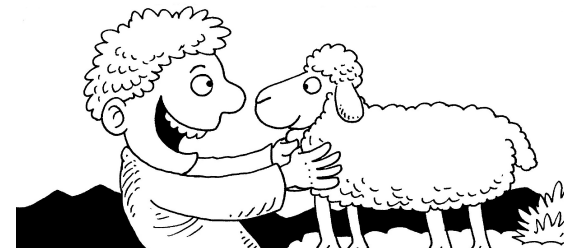


He was very worried because the sheep could have fallen into a hole and broken his leg
