I have heard this idea put forth: that the Bible does not have any kind of commandment or law against child abuse, specif cally sexual abuse. (This statement has been made lately with regard to the fact of clerical child abuse within many church groups.)

Nothing could be farther from the truth! We should always remember that Jesus gave us this as the greatest commandments....

"And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the f rst commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12: 30-31)

Love of others is Gods' command. Certainly abuse of any kind disobeys this central commandment of the Lord.

But there is something else that Jesus said, that is very very clear and specif c about how HE FEELS ABOUT CHILD ABUSE....

"And Jesus called a little child unto him, and set him in the midst of them......But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea." (Matthew 18: 2,6)
